Dear Friends,

With all the good work done in 2015 and the plan to continue to improve we begin the year on a high note, certain that we have humanised our society a little which is one of the main goals of Acción Familiar.

I have found it particularly comforting to write this report, as I am conscious of the gap between families' needs and our ability to help them. I have been able to see first hand the large number of people that have benefitted from our hard work.

Over the year we have run training courses, counseling, psychological support, educational support, volunteer and publication courses and workshops. All of these have been accompanied by an effort to share knowledge, which allows families to look after their own needs as well as to prevent and resolve conflicts on their own.

What is Acción Familiar?

Acción Familiar is a not for profit organisation that was established in 1978 with the aim of boosting the recognition and value of the role of the family within society.

Acción Familiar legally became a Non-Governmental Organisation and was recognised for its Public Utility in 1982. Since 2004, it has held Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council of the UN (ECOSOC).


Why we do what we do?

MISSION:

To help, strengthen and promote the family as an institution.

VISION:

To be the main point of reference in terms of direct care, research and analysis of family related issues.

What is our objective?

Provision of face-to-face training workshops to support families with their educational work, offering skills for their daily life through practical training.

These take place in Madrid, Aragón, Galicia, Murcia and Castilla la Mancha, in many different centres, but mainly in colleges, and educational institutes and associations.

The monitors are experienced psychologists, teachers and professionals in the socio-educational field that use educational resources made by Acción Familiar.

The courses are free for all participants and are financed through public, private and our own funds.

To support fathers, mothers and educators, creating spaces for meeting and reflection. Thanks to the dynamic nature of our support, problems are approached from a practical perspective, enabling them to be applied to family life.

We also work with the younger family members, strengthening their autonomy and ability to make decisions on their own.

What does this involve?

Personalised, free psychological guidance, care and legal advice for individuals, couples and families, especially in times of crisis, risk and difficulty.

Methods: face-to-face, in Madrid, Zaragoza and Ferrol, and via telephone and Skype for anyone who seeks our help, regardless of where they live.

What is our objective?

- To offer a warm, personalised welcome space to those who need it.
- To assist in the development of personal skills that are essential for 'building a family.'
- To propose new ways of preventing conflicts within the family environment, especially for those who are at risk of exclusion or situations of extreme vulnerability.



In 2015, we gave free psychological care and legal advice to 2,205 people.





What does this involve?




This is one of the fundamental pillars on which Acción Familiar's activities are built upon:

Through our Virtual Classroom, our volunteers are given access to training modules where they learn about both general and specific topics. In 2015, 83 volunteers took the course on children and 13 took the course on adults.




